WNYDA YOUTH PROBONO CLINIC 2024

The WNYDA Youth Pro Bono Clinic took place on April 21, 2024, at the Niagara County Fairgrounds. It was a chilly day, but everyone appeared to have a fantastic time and learned a lot from our wonderful instructors who generously donated their time and expertise.

The Niagara County Fairgrounds provided the perfect venue for the event. The clinic was held in the large indoor arena, and despite the rain before the clinic, the outdoor arena had good footing for a warm-up. Because this was a youth educational event, the fairgrounds provided the facility and stalls for no charge. A huge thank you to our knowledgeable instructors who graciously donated their time and knowledge to educate our local youth on dressage: JoAnne Young, Judy West, Susan Gilson, Paula Cahill, Susan Gawley, Val McClosky, Natalie Shappard, Megan Boss, and Dawn Arnold. They held 20 lessons in total. Each instructor taught 2-3 lessons for 45 minutes each. Two lessons were held at a time, one at each end of the indoor arena.

We had a wide range of riders, including some with ponies who rode walk-trot, as well as other youth who typically compete in the hunter series. Our volunteers played a crucial role in setting up and tearing down, ensuring the day ran smoothly with their helpful proficiency. Megan Smits lent her talents to photographing the day. Her knowledge of dressage enabled her to capture perfect photographs of each child concentrating hard during their private lessons. Thank you to Leah Redding (ring steward), Mary Barron and Carly Starkey (check-in), Nadine Wawrzyniec, and Nancy Shaw (basket raffle). Also, a big thank you to Gillian Tagliaferro (demo rider and tear down) and Michele Kerr (set-up and snacks) for their contributions.



During lunchtime, we showcased 3 demo rides of different levels, which drew a big crowd. Molly Krotz demonstrated training level, Gillian Tagliaferro demonstrated 1st level, and Natalie Shappard performed a 2nd level test. Judy West did an excellent job announcing all the movements of each test, allowing participants to learn what is expected of the horse and rider as they progress through the levels.

Local farms, businesses, and fellow horse enthusiasts generously donated baskets for the kids to enjoy participating in the basket raffle. Dirty Birds Food Truck hosted a warm lunch for all to enjoy.

The event had an amazing turnout, and we are looking forward to next year. We are always striving to learn and improve, so we have considered many wonderful suggestions to make next year's event even better. Once again, thank you to all who volunteered for this event! WNYDA SYMPOSIUM 2024 By Natalie Sheppard

The WNYDA Symposium has been a major highlight for me the past couple of years since moving to this area - it is not only such a great opportunity to learn from the best, but it is one of the few times you get to spend a whole weekend surrounded by like-minded riders, trainers, and enthusiasts! And in every sense this year's symposium with Kristi Wysocki did not disappoint!

This year's topic was essentially the ways in which different conformation can affect the training and performance of each horse. This is both a fascinating subject in general, and one that is important to the grander plan of ensuring that dressage is accessible to every horse and rider that wants to participate at any level! I was lucky enough to be chosen as one of the demo riders - or rather, I should say my horse was chosen, as Krist made a concerted effort to ensure that we had a broad field of different breeds and body types to compare throughout the weekend. Additionally, conformation photos of each of the horses were included in the program, so that spectators could clearly see each physical trait being discussed and make notes.

Each demo was insightful, detailed, and hands-on. Kristi stood to point out each detail on the horse's



body as they stood, held a dressage whip up to clearly display the angles in question, and engaged with the audience about how they thought each factor might affect each given horse's performance. She was able to predict certain strengths and weaknesses in many of the horse's movement patterns, and offered helpful insight into how one might feature the good or compensate for the bad. There were even demos of how to improve one's sitting trot using a yoga ball, and a simulation involving a bit with reins wrapped around one participant's waist while the other held the reins in order for each to feel the effects of different levels of contact.

After a long day of learning, we all got together for a delightful taco dinner! Kristi had many fascinating stories of her experiences as a judge, and also shared several insights into the equestrian industry and the current state of our sport. Many of us who might only see each other in passing at shows had a chance to catch up and socialize, and the energy of the group as a whole was invigorating.

So many of us feel like we are practicing dressage in a vacuum year round, alone in our arenas, and I think it is so important to connect with the larger community like this whenever possible to keep our passion for the sport ignited and fresh! The 2024 Symposium certainly provided a good dose of that for me, and I look forward to seeing even more of you come together to learn and celebrate in 2025!
